



HOW TO ENTER

Youth accepted include those enrolled in public, private, and parochial schools as well as those in accredited home schools, after school programs, or scouts. Each student must submit only **one entry** depicting a Mississippi native fish or wildlife species. Each student must submit the **Entry Form** and **art piece** no later than **May 10, 2024**. (Do not use staples to attach these items.)

Entries must be clearly addressed and may be sent or delivered to the following:

At this time, art entries cannot be returned. **However, participants can claim their artwork at the above location after the contest, or teachers/schools can send a pre-paid return envelope. (Please see FAQ section at the end of this document.)**

Entry Form

Entry forms must be filled out completely to avoid disqualification and must accompany each art piece. **If children are home-schooled or do not have an art teacher, the parent/guardian can also sign as the teacher.** For questions on the entry form, please call the Visitor Education Center at (662) 563 – 8688.

Entry Checklist

Please read completely. This checklist is used to determine eligible for entry in the contest:

- Art should depict a type of **native** species that live or migrate within Mississippi. Artwork depicting male and female or adult and juvenile of the species is accepted.

- Only one piece per one student.
- Artwork must be the artist's original work. Entries may not be traced or copied from published works. **Photographs can only be used as guides.** Photographs or images created with computer software are **not accepted** and will be immediately disqualified. **No assistance with computer software is allowed.**
- Artwork cannot be framed. Pictures can be matted.
- **Entries must be postmarked by May 10, 2024.**
- Artwork must be the original work of the student entering the contest. Any medium or mixture of medium is accepted. Examples include but are not limited to the following:
 - Water color
 - Pencil
 - Chalk
 - Lead
 - Dry brush
 - Charcoal
 - Crayon
 - Collage
 - Mosaic
 - Sculpture
 - Woodcarving
 - Woodburning
- Chalk and lead creations must be sealed with adhesive.
- No names or initials can be visible on the artwork. All names or initials will be covered for judging, which may affect score.

- 5 – 7
- 8 – 11
- 12 – 15
- 16 – 19

Judging Criteria: Grading rubric provided on website.

- Concept and Originality: Exhibits creativity
- Composition: Effective use of form
- Overall Appearance: Cleanness
- Elements of Art: Color, space, line, and texture
- Craftsmanship: Use of medium and material
- Degree of Difficulty: Appropriate for artist's ability and age
- Wildlife Message Content: Accuracy of wildlife message
- Accuracy of species/habitat: Correct color, habitat, etc.

Winners & Honorable Mentions:

Each category will have first, second, and third place winners. Winners will have their work included in *Mississippi Outdoors* magazine and posted on the Bob Tyler Fish Hatchery website. Each winner will receive a certificate and a complimentary copy of the *Mississippi Outdoors* magazine displaying their work.

First place winners will also receive a BassPro gift card of \$100. Second place winners will receive a \$50 gift card. Third place winners will receive a \$25 gift card.

Any honorable mentions will have their work displayed on the Bob Tyler Fish Hatchery website.

Winners and honorable mentions will be notified by email or phone. Please include this information on the entry form.

FAQs:

1. Can more than one student work on a collaborative project?

No. Categories are limited to one piece per one youth.

2. Can students with special needs participate?

Yes! Students of all ages and abilities are welcome to participate.

3. When will students receive their magazine and certificate?

The art contest article usually appears in the Sept/Oct issue of *MS Outdoors*. Certificates are usually mailed in June after judging is completed and winners are notified. **The address provided on the forms is the address the VEC will use to mail these items.**

4. When will judging be completed?

The judging varies from year to year. Judging is usually completed before Memorial Day weekend.

5. Who picks up art pieces, the parents or the school?

Parents and/or art teachers will be allowed to pick up artwork. Please contact your child's art teacher to inquire about pick-up or contact the VEC at (662) 563-8688 to see if artwork is pending pick-up.

6. **Can the VEC mail pieces back or are electronic entries accepted?**

Although we are continuing to implement ways to improve the contest, we are not accepting electronic entries at this time. We accept all size artworks, so return is not possible at this point. *If you have questions, please contact the VEC at (662) 563-8688.*

7. Do the same judges grade the artwork each year?

No. Judges will vary year to year.
